■ What NOT to Put Down Sinks & Toilets

(Help keep plumbing happy & avoid costly repairs!)

■ Sinks

- Grease, oil, or fat (including bacon grease, butter, cooking oil)
- Coffee grounds
- Food scraps, rice, pasta, or oatmeal
- Eggshells
- Flour or dough
- Harsh chemicals, paints, or solvents
- Tip: Wipe greasy pans with a paper towel before washing, and use your trash or compost for food scraps.

Toilets

- "Flushable" wipes (they aren't truly flushable!)
- Paper towels or napkins
- Feminine products (tampons, pads, wrappers)
- Cotton balls, swabs, or dental floss
- Cat litter or pet waste bags
- Diapers or wipes of any kind
- Medication or cleaning supplies

■ Why This Matters

When these items go down drains, they cause clogs, backups, and expensive plumbing bills. Protect your home and avoid repair costs by keeping drains clear!
